



Intellectual Property Licensing Requests

Apollo Education Group, Inc. (Apollo) respects the intellectual property rights of others, and it seriously considers requests for licensing of third-party intellectual property. Licensing requests to Apollo should include:

- Submitter's name, company or institution name, email, and phone number
- Non-confidential and non-proprietary description of the opportunity

By submitting a licensing request, the submitter acknowledges that:

- All licensing requests, and associated materials, will be treated as non-confidential unless the disclosure is covered by a separate, formal, written confidentiality agreement signed by Apollo prior to the time the information is disclosed to Apollo.
- The licensing request and materials will not be received or treated by Apollo in confidence, nor will its consideration by Apollo give rise to any confidential relationship between parties. Apollo may disclose the contents of the licensing request for any purpose to employees, consultants, third parties or any other persons it deems necessary.
- Apollo will give the licensing request such consideration, if any, as Apollo, in its sole and absolute discretion, believes that it merits. Apollo may request additional information from the Submitter before determining the merits of the license request
- Apollo shall not be obligated to provide the submitter with any information whatsoever concerning the nature, extent, or results of Apollo's evaluation of the licensing request.
- For the purpose of willful infringement or the inducement of infringement, Apollo's receipt of licensing request and related materials shall not constitute notice or knowledge of any patent or claim of patent infringement to Apollo.
- If Apollo chooses to license from the Submitter, Apollo will be under no obligation of any kind unless it enters into a formal written agreement signed by all parties involved.
